## **Successes and Questions**

We have once again excelled in service to our neighbors providing an incredible amount of wholesome food to sustain them through times of difficulty. In numbers 10,388 people in 3,886 families visited us during the year including 3,895 children. Each week about 700 children in 19 Paradise Valley schools took home weekend food packed and paid for by the food bank. The children in thirty six schools and their nurses availed themselves of juice and crackers for the dispensing of medicine also purchased by the food bank. Support of snack programs and summer snack programs at some elementary schools was also provided by the food bank. Additionally, many of our fellow charities were the recipients of perishable and non-perishable foodstuffs, in excess of 50,000 pounds, given by the food bank to insure that food did not go to waste in our community.

As humble as we are, this achievement is worth boasting about, especially for an organization of our size that has an all-volunteer staff. What we request from these volunteers is a dedication and commitment well out of the ordinary.

We are at a transition point in our existence. In our first thirty-two years, we were carried forward by a core of volunteers, many since nearly the beginning, with all thanks and glory to them. Now we face the inevitable question of who will carry us through the next thirty-two years. We must begin to answer the questions of what we must do to sustain ourselves and move forward. Does our location suit our clients? Does our rental space and building design suit our needs? Can we integrate technology into our process when we do not have volunteers familiar with that technology? Can we continue to meet the physical challenges of our "heavy work" when our average volunteer is well beyond retirement age? Can we expect to attract people with the professional skill set necessary to move us forward without compensating them?

We are an optimistic bunch. I know we will find the answers.
