The fairness we champion by holding our clients to a standard with a set of expectations including making an appointment, coming on time, and providing the proof required for service.

The special programs we have initiated at the request of school district personnel to meet those needs not addressed by the tax supported school budget including our backpack program and our school nurses program.

The efforts we make to share our excess with many other charities so that food finds its way to the needy in the greater community.

The special relationship we have with our many donors, whose support appears year after year without solicitation, who appreciate the fact that their gifts stay within the community and that none of what they sacrifice from their own pockets goes into someone else's pocket. We are all volunteers.

Our Record of Service

In 2016 we provided service to 3,848 families that were comprised of 10,660 individuals of which 4,335 were children. At each assist, the client received a one week supply of foodstuffs, both perishable and non-perishable, to help them move past their emergency situation and return to self-sufficiency.

Our ability to provide these generous food boxes depends on the donors who, through organized food drives and individual donations, allow us to address the needs of the community. These locally sponsored efforts produced an incredible 240,000 pounds of food. As we have expenses beyond the cost of food, we must also attract cash donations to cover these costs. Once again our community responded. In 2016 the support of our neighbors and others produced a total of \$210,000 in cash donations offset by expenses of \$190,000. Any year with a positive balance of any size is a successful year.

By far our greatest expenses are produced by the purchase of food for our signature programs, the "Backpack Program" and the "Nurses' Program." Currently the weekend food in the backpack program is distributed in 17 schools to 600 students each week. Our Nurses Program, which is comprised of juice and crackers for use when dispensing medicines at school, is active in 19 schools. We are committed to meet the needs of children in our area as identified by those who work with these children – teachers and social workers.
